I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

Visit of Dy. Ambassador of Indonesia at SMP, Kolkata

On 8.4.2021, HEMrFerdypaiy, Dy. Ambassador and Chargé d'affaires, Embassy of Indonesia, with a delegation from Indonesian Embassy, visited SMP, Kolkata when wide ranging discussions were held to improve trade avenues between Indonesian Ports & SMP, Kolkata.



Visit of Consul-General of Australia at SMP, Kolkata

On 9.4.2021, Ms Rowan Ainsworth, Consul-General of Australia visited SMP, Kolkata with discussions being held regarding Australia's support in expanding trade & investment interests in the Eastern & North Eastern states of India and in Port sector.



Cleanliness and massive Sanitisation drive on the wake of fresh Covid surge

On 25th April, 2021 SMP, Kolkata has made its mission to protect its teams at port premises and is proactively carrying out intensive sanitization drives to curb the spread of the virus. The shipping berths and CFS Administrative building are being thoroughly sanitized with the motto: "SAFETY IS OUR PRIORITY".

Under the guidance of MoSP&H, the war on containment of the deadly virus was put on a high gear with strict compliance of Covid safety procedures, testing, treating and sustained vaccination drives. Hired tug boats, Open yards at KPD lock area, gates, MCHE, 22,23,24 berths of KDS, various berths at NSD, offices at GRJ& HDC, office, Marine Crew Quarters& nearest yards and shed setc are being routinely sanitized. Existing medical facilities/equipment at Port Hospitals at KDS/HDC are being upgraded/ augmented with additional areas being converted to Covid Care Ashrams to cater to recovering COVID patients with mild to moderate symptoms.

II. CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 4.871 million tonnes (mt) of traffic during April 2021 vis-à-vis 3.741 mt during April 2020, registering a very high growth of 30.21% ranking 5th among Indian Major Ports despite resurgence of Covid 19.
- HDC handled 3.699 mt of cargo during April 2021 vis-à-vis 2.732 mt during April 2020 (recording a very high growth of 35.40%). KDS handled 1.172 mt of cargo in April 2021 vis-à-vis 1.009 mt in April 2020 (recording 16.15% growth).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Crude), Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid Cargo, Raw Materials for Fertiliser, Iron Ore, Coking Coal, Non-Coking Coal, Container, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Fertiliser, Container, Fly Ash, Iron & Steel etc. during April 2021.
- SMP, Kolkata ranked 2nd in Other Liquid Cargo as well as Coking & Other Coal handling among Major Ports in the month under review.

III. CONTAINER TRAFFIC :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 64,066 TEUs (KDS: 49,383 & HDC: 14,683) in April 2021 vis-à-vis 44,137 TEUs (KDS: 36,044 & HDC: 8,093) during April 2020, registering a very high growth of 45.15%, ranking 4th among Indian Major Ports.
- KDS registered a high growth of 37.01% while HDC recorded a very high growth of 81.43% during April 2021 vis-à-vis April 2020 in handling of Container (TEUs).

IV. SHIP TRAFFIC:

- During April 2021, 274 ships (KDS: 89, HDC: 185) called at SMP, Kolkata. 375 vessels (185 inward; 190 outward) passed through Eden channel in April 2021 to / from Haldia.

V. RAILWAY TRAFFIC :

- During April 2021, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 2.547 mt (KDS- 0.397 mt & HDC- 2.150 mt) against 1.740 mt (KDS-0.399 mt & HDC-1.341 mt) in April 2020 registering a very high growth of 46.38%. During 2020-21, 95 trains were received and 102 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 421 trains were received and 423 despatched.
