## SMP, Kolkata (erstwhile KoPT) Highlights of Achievements in February 2024

### I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

#### 1. Chairman meets stakeholders, boosting Indian Maritime sector.

In a decisive step towards improving Indian Maritime sector, Chairman, SMP, Kolkata met major Importers/ Exporters/Stakeholders dealing with Dry Bulk cargo on 12<sup>th</sup> February, 2024 to discuss prospective traffic to be routed through Port in near future, thus strengthening trade collaborations and business synergy.



#### 2. Kolkata riverfront projects meeting with stakeholders, developers.

In an endeavour to undertake multiple river front land development projects in and around Kolkata, a meeting of the stakeholders along with the prominent real estate players was organised in the presence of Dy. Chairman (K) on 12.02.2024 to discuss various upcoming projects.



#### 3. Implementation of the MoUs at the GMIS 2023 Stakeholders' Meet

In the context of execution of MoUs inked in the GMIS 2023, held in Oct, 2023, SMPK participated in the Stakeholders' meeting held at New Delhi on 16.02.2024. Hon'ble Union Minister, MoPSW, Secretary, MoPSW and other dignitaries were also present in the Stakeholders' meet which provided the right push to taking the MoUs forward for an improved eco-system of maritime infrastructure.



#### 4. 4<sup>th</sup> Quarterly meeting on MACN (Maritime Anti-Corruption Network)

The 4<sup>th</sup> quarterly meeting on MACN (Maritime Anti-Corruption Network) aimed at anti-corruption compliance enforcement through the 3 pillars of Capability Building Collective Action & Collaboration was held on 16.02.2024 at Kolkata, presided over by Shri Rajiv Jalota, Chairperson, MbPA and Chairman, IPA, attended by important functionaries / Stakeholders viz. former Secretary to GOI and Director General of Shipping, Chairperson, SMPK, Dy. Chairperson, SMPK among others.



#### 5. SMPK wins the All India Major Ports Hockey and Badminton Championships

SMPK's men's team grabbed the title at the All India Major Ports Hockey Championships in Kolkata from 20th to 23rd, February 2024. Meanwhile, the women's Badminton team triumphed at the All India Major Ports Badminton Championships in Chennai from 7<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> February, 2024.



## II CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 61.049 million metric tonnes (MMT) of cargo during April-February, 2023-24 vis-à-vis 59.842 MMT during April- February, 2022-23, **registering an increase of 2.02%**.
- HDC handled 45.465 MMT of cargo during April- February, 2023-24 vis-à-vis 44.231 MMT during April- February, 2022-23 (an increase of 2.79 %). KDS handled 15.584 MMT of cargo in April-February, 2023-24 vis-à-vis 15.611 MMT during April- February, 2022-23 (a nominal decrease of 0.17%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Other Liquid, Vegetable Oil, Iron Ore, Other Coal / Coke, Finished Fertilizer, Container TEUs, Other General Cargo etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Finished Fertilizer, Timber, Other Coal / Coke, Pulses & Peas, Container (both TEUs and Tonnage) etc. during April- February, 2023-24 vis-à-vis corresponding period of last year.

## III CONTAINER TRAFFIC:

SMP, Kolkata handled 6,88,583 TEUs (KDS: 5,87,178 & HDC: 1,01,405) during April- February, 2023-24 vis-à-vis 6,15,820 TEUs (KDS: 5,21,241 & HDC: 94,579) during April- February, 2022-23, an increase of **11.82%**.

#### **IV SHIP TRAFFIC:**

During April- February, 2023-24, 3026 ships (KDS: 1127, HDC: 1899) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 2804 ships (KDS: 1019, HDC: 1785) in April- February, 2022-23, recording an increase of 7.92 %. 3803 vessels (1899 inward; 1904 outward) passed through Eden Channel during April- February, 2023-24, to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 3565 vessels (1785 inward; 1780 outward) during April- February, 2022-23.

#### **V COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :**

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in handling of Coking/Other Coal, 2<sup>nd</sup> in handling of Other Liquids and 3<sup>rd</sup> in handling of Finished Fertilizer, Container TEUs & Other Misc. Cargo amongst the Indian Major Ports during April to February 2023-24.

#### **VI RAILWAY TRAFFIC :**

During April-February, 2023-24, SMP, Kolkata handled rail borne cargo of 31.39 MMT (HDC-26.45, KDS- 4.94 MMT) against 31.51 MMT (HDC-26.15 MMT, KDS- 5.36 MMT) in April-February, 2022-23. During April-February, 2023-24, 1155 rakes were received and 1161 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 5837 rakes were received and 5815 were despatched in the period under review.

#### **Commendable Achievements of HDC Railway during April-February 2023-24:**

- Rail borne traffic of HDC recorded 1.15 % growth over the previous year **and expected to touch 29 MMT before end of this fiscal.**
  - **Highest Loading of Rakes:** 5921 rakes, the highest, were loaded during April-February 2023-24, registering a growth of 3.22 % over the previous highest of 5736 in 2022-23.
  - **Highest Interchange of Rakes:** 11,652 Rakes, the highest till date, were interchanged in April-February 2023-24 (0.84% growth), compared to 11,555 rakes in the corresponding period of last year.
