5. PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

A. Cargo Traffic:

- **KoPT handled 47.094 million tonnes of traffic in Apr-Dec'19 vis-à-vis 46.127 mt in Apr-Dec'18 registering a growth of 2.10% - higher than 0.98% growth for Major Ports. During Apr-Dec'19, HDC handled 33.759 mt recording a growth of 2.72% whereas KDS handled 13.335 mt (0.54% growth).**
- **KoPT recorded growth in Apr-Dec'19** in respect of POL (Product), LPG, Vegetable Oil, Iron Ore, Other Ore, Fertiliser, Sulphur, Fly Ash, Metallurgical Coke, Petroleum Coke, Container, IVW Traffic, etc.

B. Container Traffic:

- **KoPT handled 6,50,299 TEUs in Apr-Dec'19 vis-à-vis 6,32,068 TEUs in Apr-Dec'18, registering 2.88% growth. The port ranked 3rd amongst all Indian Major Ports in terms of Container Traffic.**
- **In the current fiscal, KoPT handled the highest ever monthly container traffic of 77130 TEUs in July'19. KDS achieved highest ever monthly container handling of 62,710 TEUs in October 2019.**

C. Comparative Performance:

- **KoPT ranked 5th in Apr-Dec'19 in overall cargo handling amongst Indian Major Ports.**
- **KoPT ranked 1st in Coking/Other Coal, 2nd in Other Liquids and 3rd in Container handling among Major Ports.**

D. Ship Traffic:

- **In Apr-Dec'19, KoPT handled 2609 ships - the highest among Indian Major Ports. 3282 vessels (1639 inward; 1643 outward) passed through Eden channel in Apr-Dec'19 to / from Haldia.**

E. Railway Traffic:

- **In Apr-Dec'19, KoPT handled rail-borne traffic of 21.54 mt (KDS-3.70 mt & HDC-17.84 mt). In Apr-Dec'19, 852 trains were received and 868 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 3478 trains were received and 3470 were despatched.**

F. Major Achievements:

- KoPT organized a mock drill at 2nd Oil Jetty of HDC on 12.12.19 to combat the likely crisis arising out of Oil fire and spillage in association with NDRF, Coast Guard, CISF, Police, WB Fire Service, Oil Industries and concerned Port Users. Earlier, basic **training on Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (CBRN) Emergency Management** at Major Ports, jointly conducted by NDMA, INMAS & IPA with support of NDRF, was held at KDS from 18th to 22nd Nov'19.
- For the **first time, 61853 mt of Steam Coal was discharged from fully loaded Supramax Bulk Carrier MV Ilektra** at the anchorages at Sandheads and Sagar, slated for KDS by barges.
- **'MV Shining Bliss'** entered impounded dock of HDC on 14.11.19, with **highest parcel load of Limestone (36695 mt).**
- KoPT won the **Champion's Trophy in All India Major Ports Table Tennis Championships 2019-20** at Mumbai in Dec'19 achieving the unique feat on 18 occasions in the last 23 years. In Dec'19, **KoPT hosted the 41st All India Major Ports Hockey Championship 2019-20** in Dec'19, where **Mumbai Port** emerged the **Champion** and **Kolkata Port** the **Runners-up**.
- As a token humanitarian gesture, around **200 'Bulbul' storm stricken villagers were sheltered** at Sagar Pilot Station of KoPT.
- Customs facilitation across ports, joint safety security aid plan, green energy for ships and others were the direct takeaways of the **BIMSTEC Port Conclave held at Visakhapatnam Port** from 7th to 8th Nov'19.
- Hon'ble Union Minister of Shipping (IC) Shri Mansukh Mandaviya inaugurated the **RFID Operation at KDS, CCTV Operations at KDS & Rabindra Setu and three Truck Parking Terminals at KDS**. The RFID system will provide single window system to port users for obtaining permit / passes through cashless transactions.
- **Fixed Window Berthing of container vessels** at MHC berths introduced at KDS for feeder operators through open tender. This is expected to improve efficiency and volume of cargo.
- **KoPT observed 'Rashtriya Ekta Diwas'** on 31.10.19, **'Vigilance Awareness Week'** (28th Oct to 2nd Nov'19), **Swachhta Pakhwada** (16-30 Sept'19) and **Samvidhan Diwas on 26.11.19**.
- **River cruise was organized from Indenture Memorial Jetty**, a historic place with an old Clock Tower on KoPT land at Khidirpur as a part of KoPT's efforts to promote cruise tourism.
- **HDC received National Safety Award Runners Up - 2017** on 17.9.19 for safe on-board Port Operation from Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Labour & Employment at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi.
- To improve employees' participation in management/utilize their potential, KoPT organized an in-house **'Ideabox Challenge' competition**. Top ideas included amphibious pilot launches, park-o-mats, digital library, rooftop restaurants, etc. Sri Gopal Krishna, IAS, Secretary (Shipping), GoI appreciated the efforts and felicitated the winners on 4.9.19.
- Under the aegis of **"Jal Shakti Abhiyan"** at CISF Unit, **rain water storage** has been initiated by KoPT.
- **Container operations started at KP Docks, KDS, after more than a decade, with MV Trans Samudera** from Bangladesh, discharging containers at 6 KPD.
- **Interchanging of Lock Gate work** executed at HDC aimed at higher number of vessel servicing leading to less TRT.
- **Mechanisation of 3 NSD Berth at KDS** brings an additional berth, apart from 4, 5 & 8 NSD under MHC operation.
