I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

First export rake flagged off from Siliguri ICD

The first export cargo from Dabgram ICD, Siliguri, with Reefer Containers reached KDS on 29.5.21. This is the 1st container train brought by private operator with 28 TEUs of deep frozen reefer cargo weighing over 500 Tonnes. The rail connectivity opens up direct access of SMP, Kolkata to North Bengal & North Eastern India. To this effect MoU was inked earlier with the operator, in the backdrop of MIS 2021, under the auspices of MoPSW.

Gearing up of Centenary Hospital to meet the Challenging times

Under the guidance of Ministry, the entire hospital administration has been totally geared up to face the challenging times with all categories of employees working on war-footing. A Liquid Oxygen Tank of 3000 litres is being installed. 10 more HFNO machines are being procured. 10 additional Doctors and 10 more Nurses are being engaged on contract basis. 2 Plasma Donation Camps have been organized. 1 Covid ashram with 21 beds is operational; another with 24 beds shall be ready shortly.

In-house video guides and sanitization of office & work spaces by Fog Cannon

To combat the raging pandemic and for the Safety of the Personnel, in-house video guides are being widely circulated to create awareness and knowledge. Sanitization of open yards at NSD and jetties under SMP, Kolkata started on 4.5.2021 by Fog Cannon.

Preparedness for Cyclone Yaas

As a measure of preparedness against Cyclone Yaas, choked pipeline from SMP, Kolkata Guest House to KMC main line was cleaned on 23.05.2021 with Jetting Machine to avoid water logging. The Guest House is one of the designated Safe Houses in Kolkata for SMP personnel engaged in disaster management.

Drains were cleaned using JCBs and Jetting cum Suction Machines. Securing of gangways, cranes and additional waterproofing at KDS, HDC & DH were done on 24.5.2021 on war footing to minimize losses.

Virtual briefing of the representatives of News Media for the benefit of shipping fraternity



SMP, Kolkata Covid-19 feat



The oxygen requirement at Centenary Hospital, Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port (SMP), has increased manifold because of the pandemic. From about 10 jumbo oxygen cylinders daily consumption, it has risen to about 80 a day. This means that the cylinders have to be refilled daily; difficult when the supply is limited. To overcome this, Linde was contacted and they have offered to set up a 3KL (3,000 litres) liquid oxygen tank in the hospital premises. This should fulfil the oxygen demand of the hospital for about 20 to 30 days. The tank will be filled up by the liquid oxygen tankers of Linde as and when required. This measure, under the direction of Vinit Kumar, chairman, SMP, is expected to solve the oxygen problem at the hospital to a large extent and improve patient care. Under the guidance of Union Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways and Kumar, hospital administration is geared up for all challenges.

As measures of abundant precaution against the possible adversities of the impending cyclone 'Yaas', SMP, Kolkata took special measures on war footing to tie all vessels in the dock to protect human lives, vessels and properties.

Control rooms were in place at strategic operational locations at KDS & HDC to receive, process and relay important messages/inputs to mobilize resources and personnel across various functional areas of docks/jetties/lock systems to avert possible damages.

The supplies of food, provisions, critical accessories including oxygen etc were stocked adequately at the SMPK hospitals to ensure appropriate care of critically ill patients during and in the aftermath of the cyclone.

The logistics preparedness assumed all the more criticality due to restriction of transport facilities and near lock down conditions clamped on the state because of the raging pandemic.

Kolkata port to dock all vessels, tie ships to avoid loss from 'Yaas'

In consultation with the respective governments, Kolkata Port and airport authorities have initiated several preventive measures against cyclone Yaas to avoid loss of lives and properties.

The Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port Trust, Kolkata took several decisions and the implementation of which will commence from 25 May. While all vessels from all over the world have already been moved out, ships inside the port will be secured with additional measures. All port vessels are being secured inside impounded docks.

There will be no shipping movement from 24 May onwards till the cyclone weakens. All cargo handling operations will be suspended at 7 pm on 25 May. All

Before the arrival of the cyclone Yaas, all vessels of Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port (Formerly Kolkata Port Trust) have been taken inside dock for shelter and fastened, said Amrit Kumar, chairman, Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port (SMP), on Monday. The port authorities have stopped the movement of vessels from Monday evening. All cargo handling operations will be suspended from 7 pm on Tuesday while all cargo handling personnel will be moved out of docks by 6 pm on Tuesday. All barges have been instructed to be in the impounded docks or creeks of the upstream of Howrah Bridge

Commencement of Shipping operation after Yaas Cyclone

After halting of operations, as precautionary measure for some hours due to Yaas Cyclone, shipping operations resumed both at HDC & KDS on 26.05.21 with the sailing out of 'MV Star Amber' from HDC on 28.5.21. Thanks to elaborate preparedness and proactive action, no damages were caused to any personnel or Port Infrastructure.



Monetization of Dredged Material

Dredged spoils is being used as land filling material by the private developers at SMP, Kolkata since 5.5.2021 to promote reuse and monetization of such spoils, thereby exploring new vistas of opportunities.



II. CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 9.090 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April-May, 2021, vis-à-vis 7.438 mt during April-May, 2020, registering a growth of 22.21%, despite resurgence of second wave of Covid 19 and devastating cyclone 'Yaas'.
- HDC handled 6.894 mt of cargo during April-May, 2021 vis-à-vis 5.613 mt during April –May, 2020 (recording a high growth of 22.82%). KDS handled 2.196 mt of cargo in April-May, 2021 vis-à-vis 1.825 mt during April –May, 2020 (recording a high growth of 20.33%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, Iron Ore, Coking Coal, Other Coal / Coke, Limestone, Container, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Vegetable Oil, Fertiliser, Fly Ash and Container.

III. CONTAINER TRAFFIC :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 1,24,917 TEUs (KDS: 95,715 & HDC: 29,202) during April –May, 2021 vis-à-vis 88,694 TEUs (KDS: 69,840 & HDC: 18,854) during April-May,2020, registering a high growth of 40.84%.
- KDS registered a high growth of 37.05% while HDC recorded a very high growth of 54.88% during April –May, 2021 vis-à-vis April-May, 2020 in handling of Containers (TEUs).

IV. SHIP TRAFFIC:

- During April -May 2021, 511 ships (KDS: 173, HDC: 338) called at SMP, Kolkata. 678 vessels (338 inward; 340 outward) passed through Eden channel in April -May 2021 to / from Haldia.

V. RAILWAY TRAFFIC :

During April –May, 2021, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 4.948 mt (KDS- 0.828 mt & HDC- 4.120 mt) against 3.712 mt (KDS-0.748 mt & HDC-2.964 mt) in April –May, 2020 registering a high growth of 33.30%. During the period under review, 197 trains were received and 203 dispatched at KDS; at HDC, 835 trains were received and 839 were dispatched.
