I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

Review Meeting taken by Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Ports, Shipping and Waterways

Chairman, KDS and other senior officers of IWAI and CSL at KDS on 15.11.2021 for expediting the following projects for the benefits of stakeholders, trade and commerce and people of the State at large:

- Feasibility of Seaplane project in West Bengal
- Development of Passenger Jetties
- Development of Ro-Ro and Cargo Transportation on the Icchamoti River, and
- Development of Ship/Barge repair facilities in NW-I area of West Bengal.

Highest number of Railway Rake Interchange (40)

The operation of 2nd Railway line from Durgachak to HDC has increased the average speed of train so the essential commodities transported by rail from HDC reached its destination faster. HDC handled highest number of interchanges 40 (In-21 and Out-19) rakes on 15.11.2021 surpassing the previous highest of 38 rakes.



II. CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 36.999 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April- November 2021, vis-à-vis 37.514 mt during April- November 2020, registering a marginal decrease of 1.37%.
- HDC handled 27.191 mt of cargo during April- November 2021 vis-à-vis 28.140 mt during April- November 2020 (a decrease of 3.37%). KDS handled 9.808 mt of cargo in April- November 2021 vis-à-vis 9.374 mt during April- November 2021 (recording a growth of 4.63%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL(Product), Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, LPG, Coking Coal, Limestone, Fertiliser & its raw materials, Manganese Ore, Container, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Vegetable Oil, Coking Coal, Fly Ash, Rice, Wheat and Container during April- November 2021, vis-à-vis similar period of last year.

III. CONTAINER TRAFFIC :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 4,98,124 TEUs (KDS: 3,85,203 & HDC: 1,12,921) during April- November 2021 vis-à-vis 4,37,712 TEUs (KDS: 3,49,147 & HDC: 88,565) during April- November 2020, registering a growth of 13.80%.
- While HDC recorded a steep growth of 27.50%, KDS too registered a growth of 10.33%, during April - November 2021 vis-à-vis April- November 2020, in handling of Containers (TEUs).

IV. COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :

SMP, Kolkata ranked 2nd in handling of both Coking/Other Coal and Other Liquids & 3rd in handling of Finished Fertilizers among the Indian Major Ports during April - November 2021.

V. SHIP TRAFFIC:

During April- November 2021, 1950 ships (KDS: 662, HDC: 1288) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 2015 ships (KDS: 655, HDC: 1360) during April- November 2020. 2648 vessels (1288 inward; 1360 outward) passed through Eden Channel during April - November 2021 to / from Haldia.

V RAILWAY TRAFFIC :

During April-November 2021, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 19.502 mt (KDS-3.689 mt & HDC- 15.813 mt) against 17.825 mt (KDS-2.971 mt & HDC-14.854 mt) in April- November 2020 registering a growth of 9.41%. During April - November 2021, 936 trains were received and 954 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 3531 trains were received and 3529 were despatched.
