SMP, Kolkata (erstwhile KoPT) Highlights of Achievements in September 2022

I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

Celebrating Indo-Bangladesh friendship & trade agreements

- On 03.09.2022, vessel "TransSamudera" flagged off by Shri Vinit Kumar, Chairman, SMPA for her maiden journey towards Chittagong, Bangladesh with container loaded with 25 MT TMT bars from Tata Steel for Assam under ACMP.
- SMPA conducts final round of trial on Kolkata - Chattogram - Seola and with return cargo on Tambil Chattogram - Kolkata route as the part of ACMP. The use of new Indo-Bangla Protocol route will not only help reduce time and logistic cost significantly but also to develop the economy of that part of India.



Signing of Concession agreements for Mechanization of Berth no. 2

On 15.09.2022, Adani Port & SEZ signed Concession agreement with SMPA for Mechanization of Berth no. 2 at HDC. For the first time in West Bengal, Adani Port & SEZ investing Rs.298.26 cr. for the said project.



Arrival of World's Largest Cape vessel "M V Mineral Yangfan" at SMPA

- SMPA is consistently maintaining its pivotal position. The Port created history again by handling MV MINERAL YANGFAN, a Cape Vessel with LOA 299.92m and Beam 50m , a/c SAIL with the highest parcel load of 69,275 MT of Coking Coal for lighterage with Floating Cranes at Sagar Anchorage on 31.08.2022
- Earlier, such distinction was achieved by MV CAPE SWAN, another cape vessel, which arrived with 66,774 MT of Coking Coal at HDC on 09.08.2022
- Previously this much load was handled by 2-3 vessels. It could happen with the great efforts of the Port employees and SAIL



Signing of Concession agreements for Rejuvenation of KPD-I West

On 26.09.2022, M/s Century Ply Ltd. signed Concession agreement with KDS of SMPA for first PPP Project - "Rejuvenation of KPD-I West on PPP mode" at an estimated cost of Rs. 181.81 crores.



Restoring of vessel M.V MarinTrust-01 with the salvage of the containers

Container Vessel M.V MarinTrust-01 plying in the Coastal Shipping Route between India and Bangladesh, listed heavily and taken to water at NSD Berth No. 5 after completion of Cargo operation on March 24, 2022 at about 10.40a.m. All the 165 containers on-board (77 containers on deck; 88 containers in hold) have been retrieved. The vessel was finally upright on 16th September 2022 and placed in awaiting berth to make berth No.5 NSD operational.

II CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 30.528 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April 2022-September 2022, vis-à-vis 27.325mt during Apr'21-Sep'21, registering an increase of 11.72% and ranked 5th in terms of cargo handling amongst Indian Major Ports.
- HDC handled 22.845 mt of cargo during Apr'22-Sep'22 vis-à-vis 20.262mt during Apr'21-Sep'21 (an increase of 12.75%). KDS handled 7.683 mt of cargo in Apr'22-Sep'22 vis-à-vis 7.063mt during Apr'21-Sep'21 (growth of 8.78%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of Pol (Crude), LPG, Manganese Ore, Other Ore, Rock Phosphate, Lime Stone, Coking Coal, Non Coking Coal, Pet Coke, Met Coke, Dolomite Powder, Project Cargo, Other Cargo, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, Fertiliser, Iron & Steel, Pulse, Coking Coal, Other Coal, Lime Stone, Machinery & Spare Parts, Container (TEUs), Other Cargo etc. during April-22 to September-22 vis-à-vis similar period of last year.

III CONTAINER TRAFFIC:

SMP, Kolkata handled 3,44,691 TEUs (KDS:2,90,766& HDC: 53,925) during Apr'22-Sep'22 vis-à-vis 3,80,675 TEUs (KDS:2,89,847& HDC: 90,828) during April'21-Sep'21, a decline of 9.45%.

IV SHIP TRAFFIC:

During Apr'22-Sep'22, 1491 ships (KDS: 534, HDC: 957) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 1453 ships (KDS: 482, HDC: 971) in Apr'21-Sep'21. 1914 vessels (957 inward; 957 outward) passed through Eden Channel during Apr'22-Sep'22 to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 1945 vessels (971 inward; 974 outward).

VCOMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1st in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in handling of both Other Liquids & Other Misc. cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during April-September 2022.

VIRAILWAY TRAFFIC :

- During Apr'22-Sep'22, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 17.56million tonnes(KDS-3.12 mt& HDC- 14.44mt) against 14.52million tonnes (KDS-2.68mt& HDC-11.84mt) in Apr'21-Sep'21,registering a growth of 20.94%. During Apr'22-Sep'22, 789 rakes were received and 811despatched at KDS; at HDC, 3227rakes were received and 3228 were despatched during the same period.
 - HDC of SMPArecorded highest ever handling of Rail borne traffic of 14.44 million tonnes in the last 6 months of FY 2022-23 surpassing previous record of 11.84 million tones handled in corresponding period of previous year, thus registering a substantial growth of 21.99%.
 - KDS of SMPA too registered a growth of 16.42% by handling Rail borne traffic of 3.12 million tonnes during Apr'22- Sep'22 vis-à-vis 2.68 million tonnes handled during Apr'21- Sep'21.
