Highlights of Achievements in June 2023**

**I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS**

**Stakeholders Meet for Maritime Sector Growth**

On June 4, 2023, SMPK organized a stakeholders' meet graced by Shri Sarbananda Sonowal, the Hon'ble Union Minister of MoPSW, Shri Shantanu Thakur, the Hon'ble Minister of State MoPSW, stakeholders and other business partners, in presence of Chairperson, Dy. Chairpersons and other senior officers of SMPK.

The event aimed to promote collaboration and exchange ideas for the growth of the maritime sector. Discussions focused on enhancing cargo handling and logistics services to drive seamless operations.



**Participation of SMPK on Logistics and Infra development in West Bengal**

On 27th June, 2023, Chairperson, SMPK interacted with the Stakeholders on "Logistics and Infra Development in West Bengal" organized by BNCCI, Bengal in presence of President, BNCCI, Past Presidents and Executive Members.

The Hon'ble Minister for Industry, Commerce and Supplies of Nepal, along with a delegation, visited various locations of Haldia Dock Complex of SMPK on 14.06.2023 where an overview of HDC including various infrastructure and projects taken up by the Port were discussed.



### Highest ever Ship Day Productivity at HDC

On June 11, 2023, M.V. KINGFISHER achieved the highest ever ship day productivity of 33,057 metric tonnes loading iron ore fines at Berth No. 14 at HDC of SMPK surpassing the previous record of 31,785 metric tonnes set by M.V. GLOVIS MAGELLAN at Berth No. 1 on 15.01.2020.



### CONCOR starts Weekly Container Train Service to Nepal

Fulfilling demand of the trade CONCOR started weekly (every Saturday), scheduled container train service w.e.f. 17.06.2023 from SMPK to Birgunj, Nepal. The scheduled train will be operational initially for three months on experimental basis.



### Celebration of World Environment Day at SMPK

On 05.06.2023, SMPK celebrated World Environment Day at Mobile X-Ray container scanning yard by planting native species of the locality. Chairperson, Dy. Chairperson (K), along with HODs, senior officers, and CISF quarter residents, participated in the program. At HDC, World Environment Day was also celebrated with Dy. Chairperson (H) and other senior officers joining in by planting saplings, committing to a clean, green, and energy-efficient environment.



### Coastal Cleaning Campaign Programme

On 16.06.2023, a coastal cleaning campaign was organized at the riverside at HDC, SMP Kolkata. The campaign was attended by SMPK's employees and school students. Over 100 people participated in the campaign, which lasted for an hour. They cleaned a 100-meter stretch of the riverside and collected 100 kilograms of plastic waste. The campaign helped to raise awareness about the importance of keeping our coastlines clean.



### Celebration of International Yoga Day by SMPK

On 21.06. 2023, as part of the 9th International Yoga Day, yoga events were held at various locations in SMP Kolkata, including on-board vessels, at the Indenture Memorial, and at Haldia Dock Complex. Around 400 individuals, including the Chairperson, Dy. Chairperson, Consulate General of Nepal, CISF, stakeholders, fire, security, police, port employees, and their family members, participated in the events.

The 155<sup>th</sup> TOLIC Meeting was held on 8.6.23 under the convenorship of Chairperson, SMPK. ‘Pattan Bharti’, the Port’s in-house Journal was released by the Chairperson and Dy Chairperson (K) on this occasion.



## **II CARGO THROUGHPUT :**

- SMP, Kolkata handled 15.142 million metric tonnes (MMT) of cargo during April -June, 2023 vis-à-vis 14.615 MMT during April -June, 2022, **registering an increase of 3.61%**.
- HDC handled 11.270 MMT of cargo during April -June, 2023 vis-à-vis 10.612 MMT during April -June, 2022 (**an increase of 6.20%**). KDS handled 3.872 MMT of cargo in April -June, 2023 vis-à-vis 4.003 mt during April -June, 2022.
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Other Liquid, Vegetable Oil, Iron Ore, Other Ore, Coking Coal, Other Coal / Coke( Incl. Metallurgical Coke), Petroleum Coke etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Finished Fertilizer, Other Coal / Coke, Timber, Pulses & Peas, Fly Ash, Manganese Ore, Container( both TEUs and Tonnage) etc. during April -June, 2023 vis-à-vis corresponding period of last year.

## **III CONTAINER TRAFFIC:**

SMP, Kolkata handled 1,80,085 TEUs (KDS: 151817 & HDC: 28268) during April -June, 2023 vis-à-vis 1,70,338 TEUs (KDS: 141380 & HDC: 28958) during April -June, 2022, an increase of 5.72%.

## **IV SHIP TRAFFIC:**

During April - June, 2023, 805 ships (KDS: 312, HDC: 493) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 735 ships (KDS: 269, HDC: 466) in April -June, 2022, an increase of 9.52%. 991 vessels (493 inward; 498 outward) passed through Eden Channel during April - June, 2023 to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 934 vessels (466 inward; 468 outward) during April - June, 2022.

## **V COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :**

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1st in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in handling of both Other Liquids & Other Misc. Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during April to June 2023.

## **VI RAILWAY TRAFFIC :**

During April -June, 2023, SMP, Kolkata handled rail borne cargo of 8.238 MMT (HDC-6.851, KDS-1.387 MMT) against 8.363 MMT (HDC-6.661 MMT, KDS - 1.702 MMT) in April -June, 2022, registering a fall of 1.49 %. During April -June, 2023, 333 rakes were received and 327 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 1566 rakes were received and 1563 were despatched in the period under review.
