Highlights of Achievements for June, 2021**

I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

Arrival of a Cape size vessel at Sagar Anchorage, with 66,000 MT of Steam Coal

In a maiden record for SMPK, a cape size vessel 'M.V. LAKE D' arrived at Sagar Anchorage, with 66000 MT of Steam Coal discharging 19,610 MT on 09.06.2021, highest ever lighterage cargo handled in a single working day at Sagar.



First Capesize vessel arrives at Sagar Anchorage, SMP Kolkata

Exim News Service KOLKATA, June 10 A HISTORICAL milestone was achieved on June 8, 2021 when M.V. LAKE D, the first Capesize vessel, under Panama flag, arrived at Sagar Anchorage which is 80 miles away from Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port, Kolkata (SMP, Kolkata) and 25 miles away from Haldia Dock Complex (HDC), highlighted a release. *(Continued on page 14)*



First Rake for Dhanbad to Bangladesh.

In another first achievement of its kind, on 27.6.2021, a Rake with 4000T of Coal for Dhanbad was exported to Khulna in Bangladesh for Rampal Power Station, set up by Bangladesh India Friendship Power Co. Limited, a Joint Venture between NTPC & Bangladesh Power Development Board.

Monthly consignments of 20,000 Tonnes of Coal are expected to be exported from SMP, Kolkata. KPD is the hub of Bangladesh Bulk traffic for Rice, Sponge Iron, Fly Ash and Coal exports.



Flagging off 40x40 HC Container Rake

In another significant event, first full train of 40x40 HC Containers from ICD Chawapayal in Ludhiana, carrying a variety of cargo from cotton yarn to auto parts bound for Bangladesh, was virtually flagged off by Chairman SMP, Kolkata on 10.6.2021.

For customers in North India, this new service from Maersk Line & Pristine Mega Logistics will save more than 12 days of cargo transit time which otherwise goes in connecting route via Mundra/JNPT, thereby reducing major logistics cost. With this service, KDS will be connecting with farthest ICD in the country and through this conduit, even to the NER, through Bangladesh.



Installation of Oxygen Concentrators at SMP, Kolkata's Centenary Hospital

Six Oxygen Concentrators have been installed at Centenary Hospital, SMP, Kolkata on 03.06.2021, donated by Hindustan Unilever India. The Concentrators will immensely help COVID patients requiring oxygen support. SMP, Kolkata expresses gratitude for this benevolent gesture.

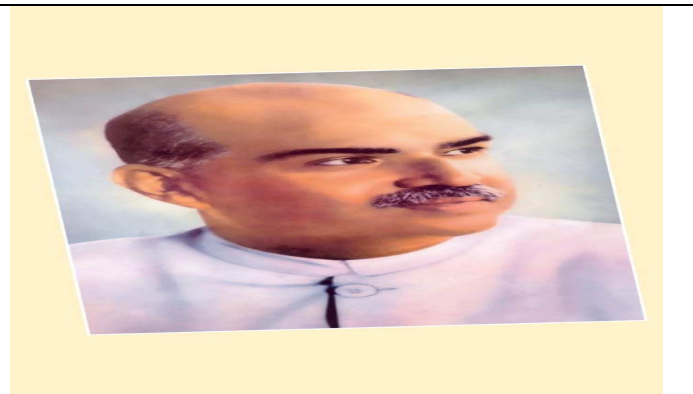
Observance of World Environment Day 2021 at SMP, Kolkata

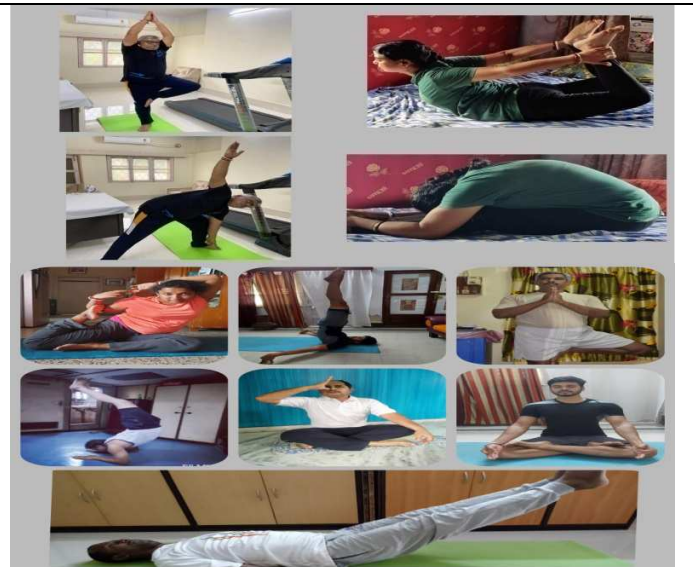
Tribute to Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerjee

Under the guidance of Shipping Ministry, Govt. of India, SMP, Kolkata, celebrated the International Yoga Day on 21st June 2021 for wellness, balancing the senses, body, soul and mind for better health and peace.



II. CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 13.717 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April-June 2021, vis-à-vis 11.830 mt during April- June 2020, registering a growth of 15.95%, despite acute affliction of the second wave of Covid 19 and the devastating cyclone 'Yaas'.
- HDC handled 10.384 mt of cargo during April- June 2021 vis-à-vis 8.967 mt during April - June 2020 (recording a growth of 15.80%). KDS handled 3.333 mt of cargo in April- June 2021 vis-à-vis 2.863 mt during April - June 2020 (recording a high growth of 16.42%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid cargo, Manganese Ore/ Slag, Other Ore, Rock Phosphate, Limestone, Cooking Coal, Other Coal/Coke, Fly Ash, Containers, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Vegetable Oil, Other liquid Cargo, Fertiliser, Fly Ash, Calcite Chips, Containers, Other Misc Cargo and IVW Traffic etc.

III. CONTAINER TRAFFIC :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 1,92,698 TEUs (KDS: 1,44,763 & HDC: 47,935) during April - June 2021 vis-à-vis 1,31,864 TEUs (KDS: 1,02,976 & HDC: 28,888) during April- June 2020, registering a high growth of 46.13%.
- While HDC recorded a steep growth of 65.93%, KDS too registered a high growth of 40.58%, during April - June 2020 vis-à-vis April- June 2020, in handling of Containers (TEUs).

IV. SHIP TRAFFIC:

- During April -June 2021, 752 ships (KDS: 253, HDC: 499) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-à-vis 696 ships (KDS: 223, HDC: 473) reflecting 8.05% growth. 1002 vessels (499 inward; 503 outward) passed through Eden channel during April - June 2021 to / from Haldia.

V. RAILWAY TRAFFIC :

- During April -June 2021, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 7.331 mt (KDS- 1.204 mt & HDC- 6.127 mt) against 6.176 mt (KDS-1.222 mt & HDC-4.954 mt) in April - June 2020 registering a high growth of 18.70%. During 2020-21, 295 trains were received and 298 dispatched at KDS; at HDC, 1281 trains were received and 1279 were dispatched.
