I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

One-on-One interaction with MoPSW subsidiaries

MoUs / Agreements signed in June'24

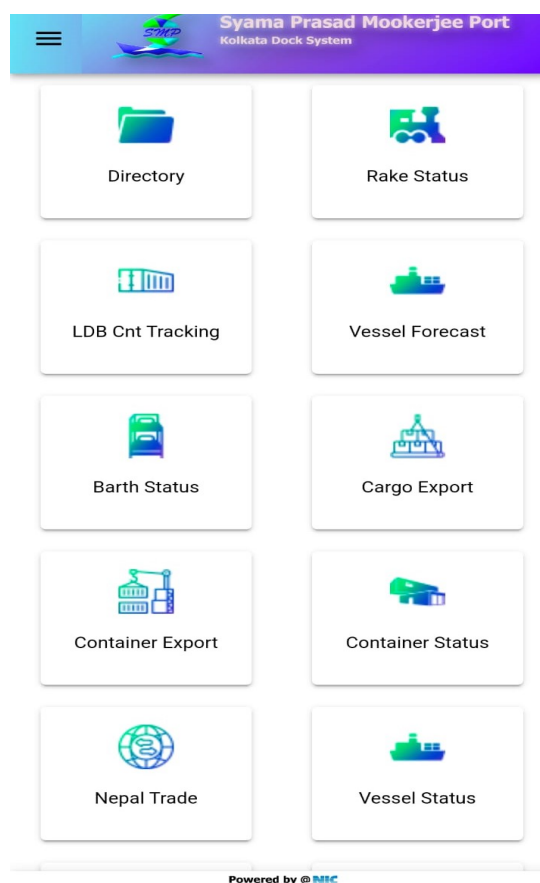

Launch of a new mobile application, PortSathi

The iOS version of the PortSathi App, designed specifically for the trade community (earlier launched on 15.09.2023) was made available in the Google play store from 17.06.2024. This app provides valuable real-time information to enhance efficiency and streamline operations at the Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port (Kolkata Dock System). Key functionalities include: Rake Status, LDB Container Tracking, Vessel Forecast, Berth Status, Cargo Export, Container Export, Container Status, Nepal Trade, Vessel Status and Vehicle Tracking

These features will help trade track shipments, monitor vessel schedules, and manage various aspects of port operations seamlessly. With real-time information, trade is expected to efficiently plan their work and stay informed about all necessary updates.



Record-Breaking Achievement at Kolkata Dock System, SMPK

The vessel MTT Labuan has set a new record by handling an impressive 1,717 TEUs, the highest number of container TEUs ever handled by a single vessel at KDS surpassing the previous record of 1,648 TEUs by MTT Senati in June 2021.

The vessel arrived at KDS on 26th June 2024 at 2000 hours at OFF 13 NSD and reached the working berth at 5 NSD on 27th June. 2024 at 0920 hours. It completed its operations on 1st July 2024 at 0625 hours, totalling 93 hours and 5 minutes at 5 NSD, with a productivity rate of approximately 18.45 TEUs per hour.

The dedicated team and stakeholders are sincerely appreciated for their efforts in advancing the Kolkata Dock System, SMPK.



Highest number of moves in a shift with one RMQC at HDC, SMPK

M.V. FSL SINGAPORE has handled 240 boxes (267 TEUs) with one RMQC in the day shift of 25.06.2024 at HDC, SMPK. This is the highest number of moves handled in a shift with one RMQC.



SMPK : Marking a new era in Shipping & Logistics

SMPK has announced the inauguration of a ground breaking direct weekly service, linking Port Klang & Yangon, marking a new era in Shipping & Logistics. The first-of-its-kind service debuted with the successful maiden voyage and berthing of the vessel, SITC Nagoya, at the Haldia International Container Terminal carrying 453 TEUs, on 6th June, 2024, arriving directly from Shanghai, China. She was greeted by exchange of plaque, attended by the Chairperson, SMPK.



First 'Port Link Express': Milestone initiative by SMPK

In a significant milestone initiative taken by SMPK, the first 'Port Link Express'- a cost effective and eco-friendly Land Bridge initiative by Rail on Haldia-Kolkata-Haldia sector was flagged off on 23.06.2024 by Dy. Chairperson, HDC, in presence of the senior officials of the Port, Terminal Operators, HITC, Pristine Logistics, Balmer Lawrie CFS & the Shipping line SITC. The train left for Balmer Lawrie CFS, Kolkata, with 80 TEUs that arrived at HDC from Shanghai through the recently introduced China Direct service of SITC line.



Observance of World Environment Day by SMPK

- SMPK observed the “World Environment Day” on 5th June, 2024 through plantation of trees led by Chairperson, SMPK, promoting “Green Port Initiatives”. Dy. Chairperson, Kolkata, Divisional Officer, WBFS and Assistant. Commandant, CISF (SMP unit) joined as Guests of Honour.

II CARGO THROUGHPUT:

- SMP, Kolkata handled 14.086 million Metric Tonnes (MMT) of cargo during April-June 2024 of FY 2024-25, vis-à-vis 15.194 MMT handled in April-June 2023 of FY 2023-24. HDC handled 10.535 MMT and KDS 3.551 MMT of cargo respectively during April-June '2024.
- HDC registered growth in respect of LPG, Other Liquid, Vegetable Oil, Finished Fertilizer, Fertilizer Raw Materials, Limestone, Manganese Ore, Other Ore, Petroleum Coke, Iron & Steel, Container Tons and TEUs, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Vegetable Oil, Fertilizer Raw Materials, Lime Stone, Petroleum Coke, Calcite Chips etc. during April-June '24 vis-à-vis April-June '23.

III CONTAINER TRAFFIC:

SMP, Kolkata handled 1,79,566 TEUs (KDS: 1,48,779 & HDC: 30,787) during April-June '24 vis-à-vis 1,80,923 TEUs (KDS: 1,52,655 & HDC: 28,268) during April-June '23, a marginal decline of 0.75%.

IV SHIP TRAFFIC:

During April-June '24, 804 ships (KDS: 267 ; HDC: 537) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 803 ships (KDS: 310, HDC: 493) in April-June '23, having a marginal increase of 0.12%. 1065 vessels (537 inward; 528 outward) passed through Eden Channel during April-June '24, to / from Haldia compared to 991 vessels (493 inward; 498 outward) during April-June '23.

V COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE : SMP, Kolkata ranked 2nd in handling of Other Liquids & Coking/Other Coal and 3rd in handling of Finished Fertilizer & Other Misc. Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during April-June 2024.

VI RAILWAY TRAFFIC :

During April-June '24, SMP, Kolkata handled rail borne cargo of 7.045 MMT (HDC-5.792, KDS- 1.253 MMT) against 8.237 MMT (HDC-6.850 MMT, KDS: 1.387 MMT) in April-June '23. During this period, 299 rakes were received and 325 despatched at KDS while at HDC, 1222 rakes were received and 1229 were despatched.
