SMP, Kolkata (erstwhile KoPT) Highlights of Achievements in June 2022

I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

Shipping Ministry organises 'Chintan Baithak' to propel India's Blue Economy

- A three-day 'Chintan Baithak' (26-28 June, 2022) organised by the MoPSW chaired by Shri Sarbananda Sonowal, Hon'ble Union Minister of PSW and Shri Shantanu Thakur, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for PSW with an aim to discuss and deliberate ideas and innovations that can propel India's Blue Economy.
- The Hon'ble Union Minister lauded the sincere efforts of Cochin Shipyard Ltd. in promoting the spirit of "Atmanirbhar Bharat", Hon'ble PM's initiative, through the development of indigenous and green technology vessels.
- Shipping Minister sets target of zero waiting time at major ports and put thrust on PPP model for mobilizing government resources for Greenfield port development.
- A total of 157 road connectivity projects and 137 rail connectivity projects are being undertaken for promoting multimodal connectivity at Ports.

II <u>CARGO THROUGHPUT</u>:

- SMP, Kolkata handled 14.420 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April 2022-June 2022, vis-à-vis 13.869 mt during Apr'21-Jun'21, registering an increase of 3.97 %.
- HDC handled 10.612 mt of cargo during Apr'22-Jun'22 vis-à-vis 10.384 mt during Apr'21-Jun'21 (an increase of 2.20%). KDS handled 3.808 mt of cargo in Apr'22-Jun'22 vis-à-vis 3.485 mt during Apr'21-Jun'21 (growth of 9.27%).
- During Apr'22-Jun'22 vis-à-vis Apr'21-Jun'21, SMPA registered growth in respect of LPG, Manganese Ore, Limestone, Other Ore (Pyroxenite, Magnesite etc.), Sulphur, Coking Coal, Other Coal /Coke (Steam Coal, Non Coking Coal etc).

III <u>CONTAINER TRAFFIC</u>:

SMP, Kolkata handled 1,70,150 TEUs (KDS:1,41,192& HDC: 28,958) during Apr'22-Jun'22 vis-àvis 1,92,756 TEUs (KDS: 1,44,821 & HDC: 47,935) during Apri1'21-Jun'21 Ongoing economic crisis in Sri Lanka is primarily responsible for decline in Container traffic at the Port.

IV <u>SHIP TRAFFIC</u>:

During Apr'22-Jun'22, 735 ships (KDS: 269, HDC: 466) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 752 ships (KDS: 253, HDC: 499) vis-à-vis Apr'21-Jun'21. 934 vessels (466 inward; 468 outward) passed through Eden Channel during Apr'22-Jun'22 to / from Haldia.

V <u>COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE</u> :

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1st in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in handling of both Other Liquids & Other Misc. Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during June 2022.

VI <u>RAILWAY TRAFFIC</u> :

During Apr'22-Jun'22, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 8.363 mt (KDS-1.702 mt & HDC-6.661 mt) against 7.331 mt (KDS-1.204 mt & HDC-6.127 mt) in Apr'21-Jun'21, registering a growth of 14.07%. During Apr'22-Jun'22, 424 rakes were received and 432 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 1448 rakes were received and 1451 were despatched during the same period .
