I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

First shipment of Naptha from HDC to Bangladesh by barge through IBP Route

After LPG, 1.9 MT of Naptha exported by the Indian Oil Corpn. on 03.07.2022 from HDC to Bangladesh for Aqua Refineries at Ghorashal through IBP route, which marked a new milestone at SMPA. This route facilitates cost effective, environmental-friendly & seamless movement of cargo.



Grow 360-MDP for SMPA Officers

SMPA conducted Grow 360-MDP to develop leadership skills for its officers from 27.06.2022 to 02.07.2022. Ms. Shraddha Goley& Com Rajiv Kubal from UTBT HR Services were the esteemed trainers who involved the participants with activities based upon behaviour modelling & problem solving.

II CARGO THROUGHPUT:

- SMP, Kolkata handled 19.818 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April 2022-July 2022, vis-à-vis 18.501mt during Apr'21-July'21, registering anincrease of 7.12%.
- ➤ HDC handled 14.665 mt of cargo during Apr'22-July'22vis-à-vis 13.813mt during Apr'21-July'21 (an increase of 6.17%). KDS handled 5.153 mt of cargo in Apr'22-July'22vis-à-vis 4.688mt during Apr'21-July'21 (growth of 9.92%).
- ➤ HDC registered growth in respect of LPG, Manganese Ore, Other Ore, Finished Fertilizer, Rock Phosphate, Sulphur, Lime Stone, Coking Coal, Other Coal, Fly Ash, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, Iron & Steel, Pulse, Coking Coal, Other Coal, Lime Stone, Container etc. during April-22 to July-22vis-à-vis similar period of last year. Moreover, 96,483 tonnes of POL(Crude)was imported through HDC during Apr'22-July'22.

III CONTAINER TRAFFIC:

SMP, Kolkata handled 2,27,891 TEUs (KDS:1,91,199 & HDC: 36,692) during Apr'22-July'22 visà-vis 2,56,108 TEUs (KDS: 1,94,401& HDC: 61,707) during Apri1'21-July'21, a decline of 11.02%.

IV SHIP TRAFFIC:

During Apr'22-July'22, 984 ships (KDS: 358, HDC: 626) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 988 ships (KDS: 328, HDC: 660) in Apr'21-July'21. 1286 vessels (626 inward; 660 outward) passed through Eden Channel during Apr'22-July'22 to / from Haldia.

V <u>COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE</u>:

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1st in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in handling of both Other Liquids & Other Misc. Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during Apr-July 2022.

VI <u>RAILWAY TRAFFIC</u>:

- During Apr'22-July'22, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 11.45mt (KDS-2.24mt& HDC-9.21mt) against 9.73mt (KDS-1.67mt& HDC-8.06mt) in Apr'21-July'21, registering a growth of 17.68%. During Apr'22-July'22, 554 rakes were received and 575 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 2054rakes were received and 2040 were despatched during the same period.
- ➤ HDC of SMP, Kolkata handled highest ever monthly rail-borne traffic of 2.55 million tonnes in July 2022 surpassing the previous highest record of 2.44 million tonnes handled during March 2021.
- ➤ HDC of SMP, Kolkata recorded highest ever monthly Interchange of 1195 trains (Inward 606 & Outward 589) in July 2022 surpassing the previous highest record of 1048 (Inward 523 & Outward 525) achieved during March 2022
- ➤ HDC of SMP, Kolkata also recorded highest loading of 588 rakes (2.17 million tonnes) in July 2022 surpassing the previous highest record of 498 rakes (1.86 million tonnes) achieved in June 2022.
