All India Major Port Cricket Tournament

The 41st All India Major Port Cricket Tournament was organized by SMP Kolkatafrom 5.12.2022 to 9.12.2022. SMP Kolkata became the champion. Shri Samrat Rahi, Dy. Chairman, KDS awarded the Trophy. Shri PL Haranadh, Chairman congratulated the winners and thanked all the participants of Major Ports.

<u>Cyber Jaagrookta (Awareness) Diwas (CJD) at</u> <u>KDS</u>

On 07.12.2022, SMPA organized Cyber Jagrookta Diwas (CJD) at KDS IT Center to create awareness towards protecting critical systems, viz., Critical Infrastructure Security, Application & Network Security, Cloud Security and Sensitive Information Security from digital & phishing attacks.

Observance of World Pollution Prevention Week

In connection with observation of World Pollution Prevention Week from 2.12.2022 at KDS, SMP Kolkata, a Dock visit was organized for the students of Presidency University, Kolkata on 6.12.2022. Green Port initiatives undertaken by the Port were discussed.

A half-day workshop on Green Port issue, in connection with observation of World Pollution Prevention week from 2nd December 2022 by all Major Ports, was organized on 07.12.2022 at CHRE, KDS, SMPK where renowned environmental Scientist Prof. Dr. Santra kindly consented to grace the occasion and share his thoughts on environmental issues.







Quarterly Health Camp organized by SMPK

The quarterly Health camp was organized atMedical Department of SMPK at 7 NSD on 03.12.2022 where Port users were screened through General examination, Vision tests, Blood sugar and ECG examinations. A total of 91 workers were examined and Health certificates issued.

Training on PPP at IIM, Ahmadabad

To further strengthen its capabilities to promote PPP in infrastructure development, MoPSW had sent its officers from all Ports to participate in training on PPP projects held at IIM, Ahmadabad from 28.11.222 to 2.12.22. Three officers from SMPK participated and updated themselves on various aspects of PPP including issues of barriers of PPP model & ways to resolve them in.



II <u>CARGO THROUGHPUT</u> :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 47.802 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April 2022-December 2022, vis-àvis 42.338 mt during Apr'21-Dec'21, registering an increase of 12.91%.
- HDC handled 35.462 mt of cargo during Apr'22- Dec'22 vis-à-vis 31.032 mt during Apr'21- Dec'21 (an increase of 14.28%). KDS handled 12.340 mt of cargo in Apr'22- Dec'22 vis-à-vis 11.306 mt during Apr'21- Dec'21 (growth of 9.15%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Crude), LPG, Other Ore, Fly ash, Lime Stone, Coking Coal, Non Coking Coal, Petroleum Coke, Metallurgical Coke, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of LPG, Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, Manganese Ore, Other Ore Finished Fertilizer, Iron & Steel, Pulse, Coking Coal, Lime Stone etc. during April-22 to December-22 vis-à-vis corresponding period of last year.

III <u>CONTAINER TRAFFIC</u>:

SMP, Kolkata handled 5,05,768 TEUs (KDS:4,30,232& HDC: 75,536) during Apr'22- Dec'22 vis-àvis 5,57,471 TEUs (KDS: 4,31,207 & HDC: 1,26,264) during Apr'21- Dec'21, a decline of 9.27%.

IV <u>SHIP TRAFFIC</u>:

During Apr'22- Dec'22, 2260 ships (KDS: 812, HDC: 1,448) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 2191ships (KDS: 745, HDC: 1446) in Apr'21- Dec'21. 2,894 vessels (1,448 inward; 1,446 outward) passed through Eden Channel during Apr'22- Dec'22 to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 2,899 vessels (1446 inward; 1,453 outward) during Apr'21- Dec'21.

V <u>COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE</u> :

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1st in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in handling of both Other Liquids & Other Misc. Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during April-December 2022. SMPK ranked 5th in Cargo handling amongst Indian Major Ports during April- December 2022 vis-a-vis its 6th during April- December 2021.

VI <u>RAILWAY TRAFFIC</u> :

During Apr'22- Dec'22, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 25.949 million tonnes (KDS-4.37 mt, HDC-21.579 mt) against 22.278 million tonnes (KDS-4.386 mt, HDC-17.892 mt) in Apr'21- Dec'21, registering a growth of 16.48%. DuringApr'22- Dec'22, 1094 rakes were received and 1121 dispatched at KDS; at HDC, 4783 rakes were received and 4785 were dispatched during the same period.
