SMP, Kolkata (erstwhile KoPT) Highlights of Achievements in JANUARY 2023

I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

Inauguration of various projects by the Hon'ble Prime Minister and the Hon'ble Union Minister, MoPSW

- The Hon'ble Prime Minister inaugurated the newly constructed multi-modal terminal at HDC on 13.1.23 with a cargo handling capacity of around over 3 MMT per annum with the berths designed to handle vessels up to 3000 DWT.
- Shri Santanu Thakur, Hon'ble Minister of State, MoPSW inaugurated the Port Server Room, especially for the purpose of navigation at HDC. Chairman, SMP Kolkata & Dy. Chairman HDC, were present during the inauguration ceremony.

The Hon'ble Minister also inaugurated an electrical Sub Station at Jawahar Tower at the HDC to be used for additional electricity generation, etc.

- Following the launch of the world's longest River Cruise vessel **Ganga Vilas**, the Hon'ble Minister, MoPSW addressed a Press Meet, wherein he discussed the impact of this event on the future of cruise shipping in India.
- The Hon'ble Minister, MoPSW held a meeting with the senior officers of SMP Kolkata to review the ongoing status of projects & daily operations.

<p><u>Record cargo handling by HDC, SMPK</u></p> <p>HDC, SMPA, Kolkata achieved the highest ever cargo handling of 4.70 MMT in January 2023, surpassing the previous highest of 4.63 MMT achieved in January 2020.</p>	
<p><u>Initiatives for G-20 summit in Kolkata</u></p> <p>In connection with the G20 Meet held from 9th to 11th January, 2023, SMP Kolkata along with KMC took special initiatives to make the city and the port cleaner, greener, more environment friendly and commercially attractive to the visitors. The Port also initiated beautification of Howrah Bridge and the adjoining areas.</p>

II CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 54.254 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April 2022-January 2023, vis-à-vis 47.282 mt during Apr’21-Jan’22, **registering an increase of 14.75%**. Incidentally, this is also higher than the growth of 9.31%, registered by the Indian Major Ports during the same period (Apr’22-Jan’23).
- SMPK ranked 5th in Cargo handling amongst Indian Major Ports during April 2022-January 2023 vis-a-vis its ranking of 6th during April 2021-January 2022.
- The share of cargo traffic of SMPK amongst the Indian Major Ports increased from 7.99 % in Apr22-Jan’23 to 8.39% in Apr22-Jan’23.

- HDC handled 40.162 mt of cargo during Apr'22- Jan'23 vis-à-vis 34.749 mt during Apr'21-Jan'22 **(an increase of 15.58%)**. KDS handled 14.092 mt of cargo in Apr'22- Jan'23 vis-à-vis 12.533 mt during Apr'21- Jan'22 **(growth of 12.44%)**.
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Crude), LPG, Other Ore, FRM, Coking Coal, Non Coking Coal, Fly ash, Lime Stone, Petroleum Coke, Metallurgical Coke, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of LPG, Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, Manganese Ore, Other Ore, Finished Fertilizer, Iron & Steel, Pulse/Peas, Coking Coal, Lime Stone, Container etc. during April-22 to January-23 vis-à-vis corresponding period of last year.

III CONTAINER TRAFFIC:

SMP, Kolkata handled 5,63,431 TEUs (KDS:4,78,446 & HDC: 84, 985) during Apr'22- Jan'23 vis-à-vis 6,21,319 TEUs (KDS: 4,80,446 & HDC: 1,40,873) during Apr'21- Jan'22, a decline of 9.32%.

IV SHIP TRAFFIC:

During Apr'22-Jan'23, 2551 ships (KDS: 925, HDC: 1626) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 2449 ships (KDS: 826, HDC: 1623) in Apr'21- Jan'22. 3245 vessels (1,625 inward; 1,620 outward) passed through Eden Channel during Apr'22-Jan'23 to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 3251 vessels (1623 inward; 1,628 outward) during Apr'21- Jan'22.

V COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1st in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in handling of both Other Liquids & Other Misc. Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during April 2022-January 2023.

VI RAILWAY TRAFFIC :

During Apr'22-Jan'23, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 28.823 million tonnes (KDS-4.92 mt, HDC-23.903 mt) against 24.974 million tonnes (KDS-4.91 mt, HDC-20.064 mt) in Apr'21- Jan'22, registering a growth of 15.41%. During Apr'22-Jan'23, 1221 rakes were received and 1249 dispatched at KDS; at HDC, 5293 rakes were received and 5300 were dispatched during the same period.
