I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

1.Shri Rathendra Raman, IRTS takes over as **Chairman**, **SMPK** Shri Rathendra Raman, I.R.T.S. andan officerof 1995 batch took over charge as Chairman, of SMP, Kolkata on 9th May,2023. 2.Flagging theInaugural Trial Movement of cargo ship to Sittwe Port, Myanmar. On 4th May, 2023 Shri Shantanu Thakur, MoS, MoPSW flagged off the first trial movement / inaugural shipment of cargo shipfrom SMP, Kolkata to operationalize Sittwe Port, Myanmar. The Port connects Paletwa, Myanmar through an inland waterway and from Paletwa to Zorinpui in Mizoram through a road component. **3.Inauguration Receipt** of Maiden & Cargo **Consignment at Sittwe Port, Myanmar** On 9th May, 2023, Shri SarbanandaSonowal,the Hon'ble Union Minister, MoPSW, GOI, along with H.E. Admiral Tin Aung San, Dy. Prime Minister & Minister for Communications received the maiden cargo vessel ITT LION bringing construction material from SMPK to Sittwe. The Sittwe Port in Rakhine State of Myanmar, built by India as part of the Kaladan Multimodal Transit Transport Project, opens up new horizons of connectivity & trade.

4.Felicitation of Trade Partners

- SMP Kolkata has handled 65.66 Million Metric Tonnes of cargo during FY 2022-23, the highest Cargo Traffic since inception, creating an alltime record in the Port's history, surpassing the previous high of 63.983 MMT handled in 2019-20.

II <u>CARGO THROUGHPUT</u>:

- SMP, Kolkata handled 10.146 million metric tonnes (MMT) of cargo during April -May, 2023 vis-à-vis 9.339 MMT during April -May, 2022, registering an increase of 8.64%.
- HDC handled 7.575 MMT of cargo during April -May, 2023 vis-à-vis 6.668 MMT during April -May, 2022 (an increase of 13.60%). KDS handled 2.571 MMT of cargo in April -May, 2023 vis-à-vis 2.671 mt during April -May, 2022.
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Other Liquid, Other Ore, Coking Coal, Other Coal / Coke, Petroleum Coke, Containers, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Finished Fertiliser, Other Coal / Coke, Timber, Pulses, Containers etc. duringApril -May, 2023 vis-à-vis corresponding period of last year.

III <u>CONTAINER TRAFFIC</u>:

SMP, Kolkata handled 1,19,481 TEUs (KDS: 98079& HDC: 21,402) during April -May, 2023 vis-à-vis 1,16,608 TEUs (KDS: 97434& HDC: 19174) during April -May, 2022, an increase of 2.46%.

IV <u>SHIP TRAFFIC</u>:

During April -May, 2023, 530 ships (KDS: 205, HDC: 325) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 481 ships (KDS: 180, HDC: 301) in April -May, 2022, an increase of 10.19%. 649 vessels (325 inward; 324 outward) passed through Eden Channel during April -May, 2023 to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 611 vessels (301 inward; 310 outward) during April -May, 2022.

V <u>COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE</u> :

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1st in handling of Coking/Other Coal and 2nd in handling of both Other Liquids & Other Misc. Cargo amongst Indian Major Ports during April-May 2023.

VI<u>RAILWAY TRAFFIC</u> :

During April -May, 2023, SMP, Kolkata handled rail borne cargo of 5.748 MMT (HDC-4.808, KDS-0.940 MMT) against 5.525 MMT (HDC-4.407 MMT, KDS-1.118 MMT) in April -May, 2022, registering a growth of 4.04%. During April -May, 2023, 220 rakes were received and 216despatched at KDS; at HDC, 1078 rakes were received and 1080 were despatched in the period under review.
