I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS

Chairpersons of the concerned dock complexes addressed the gathering while reviewing the progress of achievements made during the course of the year while further reiterating SMPK’s commitment to achieve those target.

The bright minds of the esteemed “Indian Institute of Foreign Trade” visited Haldia Dock Complex on 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2024 as a part of their industrial exposure in bolstering their understanding of Port operations and global trade dynamics, resulting in a fruitful collaboration between academia and industry.



**II CARGO THROUGHPUT :**

- SMP, Kolkata handled 56.072 million metric tonnes (MMT) of cargo during April-January, 2023-24 vis-à-vis 54.391 MMT during April- January, 2022-23, **registering an increase of 3.09% and ranked 5<sup>th</sup>** amongst the Indian Major Ports.
- HDC handled 41.632 MMT of cargo during April-January, 2023-24 vis-à-vis 40.162 MMT during April- January, 2022-23 (an increase of 3.66 %). KDS handled 14.440 MMT of cargo in April-January, 2023-24 vis-à-vis 14.229 MMT during April-January, 2022-23 **(an increase of 1.48%)**.
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL (Product), Other Liquid, Vegetable Oil, Iron Ore, Other Coal / Coke (including Petroleum Coke, Metallurgical Coke), Finished Fertilizer, Fertilizer Raw Materials, Container TEUs, Other General Cargo etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Finished Fertilizer, Fly Ash, Timber, Other Coal / Coke, Pulses & Peas, Container (both TEUs and Tonnage) etc. during April-January, 2023-24 vis-à-vis corresponding period of last year.

**III CONTAINER TRAFFIC:**

SMP, Kolkata handled 630963 TEUs (KDS: 540389 & HDC: 90574) during April-January, 2023-24 vis-à-vis 564080 TEUs (KDS: 479095 & HDC: 84985) during April-January, 2022-23, an increase of **11.86%**.

**IV SHIP TRAFFIC:**

During April-January, 2023-24, 2766 ships (KDS: 1039, HDC: 1727) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 2551 ships (KDS: 925, HDC: 1626) in April-January, 2022-23, recording an increase of 8.43 %. 3450 vessels (1727 inward; 1723 outward) passed through Eden Channel during April-January, 2023-24, to / from Haldia vis-à-vis 3246 vessels (1626 inward; 1620 outward) during April-January, 2022-23.

**V COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :**

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in handling of Coking/Other Coal, 2<sup>nd</sup> in handling of Other Liquids and 3<sup>rd</sup> in handling of Finished Fertilizer, Container TEUs & Other Misc. Cargo amongst the Indian Major Ports during April to January 2023-24.

**VIRAILWAY TRAFFIC :**

During April-January, 2023-24, SMP, Kolkata handled rail borne cargo of 28.547 MMT (HDC- 24.042, KDS- 4.505 MMT) against 28.824 MMT (HDC-23.903 MMT, KDS– 4.921 MMT) in April-January, 2022-23. During April-January, 2023-24, 1057 rakes were received and 1062 dispatched at KDS; at HDC, 5316 rakes were received and 5291 were dispatched in the period under review.
