**Highlights of Achievements in December, 2021**

**I. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS / DEVELOPMENTS**

**Inauguration of GRSE-KPDD Unit**

GRSE-KPDD Unit was inaugurated on 01.12.2021 to usher in a dynamic partnership of new business opportunities in ship repair and refit between GRSE and SMPK. The project envisages upgrading, operating and managing the infrastructural facilities at the three dry docks of KPDAimed at their effective utilization. Earlier, a Concession Agreement was inked on 7.10.2021 between SMPK and GRSE, in the august presence of Hon'ble Minister for Ports, Waterways & Shipping.



**Continuing Ship to Ship Operation at Sandheads**

SMP, Kolkata continued its Ship-To-Ship (STS) transfer of CBFS on 20.12.2021 required for Chemical industries, arranged between M.T. BW Tagus with 55576 MT on board & M.T. PGC Companion, where-in 27846 MT of CBFS was offloaded within a span of 10.5 hrs.



On 26.12.2021, in yet another STS operation, MT. BW Lord discharged 22,000 MT of LPG to Daughter vessel MT. BW Cedar within a span of 18 hrs at HDC.

**Highest ever Quantity of Cargo at HDC without anchoring at 8.8 meters draft**

Yasa Pioneer arrived at HDC, SMP, Kolkata on 4.12.2021 with 39,697 MT, without anchoring at 8.8 mtrs draft with the navigational support of SMP, Kolkata. This was the highest ever quantity of Cargo per ship received in the last 15 years which is a milestone achievement.



**Exports of Cotton bales on single barge to Narayanganj from Kolkata**

For the first time at KDS SMP, Kolkata, 8547 Cotton bales were loaded & transported as Break Bulk on a single barge to Narayanganj, through the Indo-Bangladesh Protocol route by Ocean Whale Shipping Services Pvt. Ltd., opening up a new vista of opportunity.




**Re-commencement of Heritage Tour**


### Visits of IAS Officer Trainees of 2020 batch at SMPK

On 18.12.2021, SMP, Kolkata received the first official language award from Secretary, Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs, and Government of India for excellent work in the field of official language implementation during 2019-20 in the Joint Official Language Conference of East and North Eastern Regions.



## II CARGO THROUGHPUT :

- SMP, Kolkata handled 42.143 million tonnes (mt) of cargo during April- December 2021, vis-à-vis 43.463 mt during April- December 2020, registering a decrease of 3.04%.
- HDC handled 31.032mt of cargo during April- December 2021 vis-à-vis 32.596 mt during April- December 2020 (a decrease of 4.80%). KDS handled 11.11mt of cargo in April- December 2021 vis-à-vis 10.87 mt during April- December 2021 (recording a growth of 2.25%).
- HDC registered growth in respect of POL(Product), Vegetable Oil, Other Liquid, LPG, Fertiliser& its raw materials, Coking Coal, Manganese Ore, Container, etc. while KDS registered growth in respect of Vegetable Oil, Coking Coal, Fly Ash, Raw materials of Fertiliser, Iron & Steel, Rice, Wheat and Container during April- December 2021, vis-à-vis similar period of last year.

## III CONTAINER TRAFFIC :

SMP, Kolkata handled 5,57,326 TEUs (KDS: 4,31,062& HDC: 1,26,264) during April- December 2021 vis-à-vis 4,99,172 TEUs (KDS: 3,96,773& HDC: 1,02,399) during April- December 2020, registering a growth of 11.65%. While HDC recorded a steep growth of 23.31%, KDS too registered a growth of 8.64%, during April - December 2021 vis-à-vis April- December 2020, in handling of Containers (TEUs).

## IV COMPARATIVE PERFORMANCE :

SMP, Kolkata ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in handling of Coking/Other Coal, 2<sup>nd</sup> in handling of Other Liquids and 3<sup>rd</sup> in handling of Finished Fertilizer amongst Indian Major Ports during April - December 2021.

## **V SHIP TRAFFIC:**

During April- December 2021, 2197 ships (KDS: 751, HDC: 1446) called at SMP, Kolkata vis-a-vis 2313 ships (KDS: 748, HDC: 1565) during April- December 2020. 2899 vessels (1446 inward; 1453 outward) passed through Eden Channel during April - December 2021 to / from Haldia.

## **VI RAILWAY TRAFFIC :**

During April-December 2021, SMP, Kolkata handled rail-borne traffic of 22.278 mt (KDS-4.386 mt & HDC-17.892 mt) against 20.350 mt (KDS-3.428 mt & HDC-16.922 mt) in April- December 2020 registering a growth of 9.47%. During April - December 2021, 1082 trains were received and 1106 despatched at KDS; at HDC, 4015 trains were received and 4006 were dispatched.
